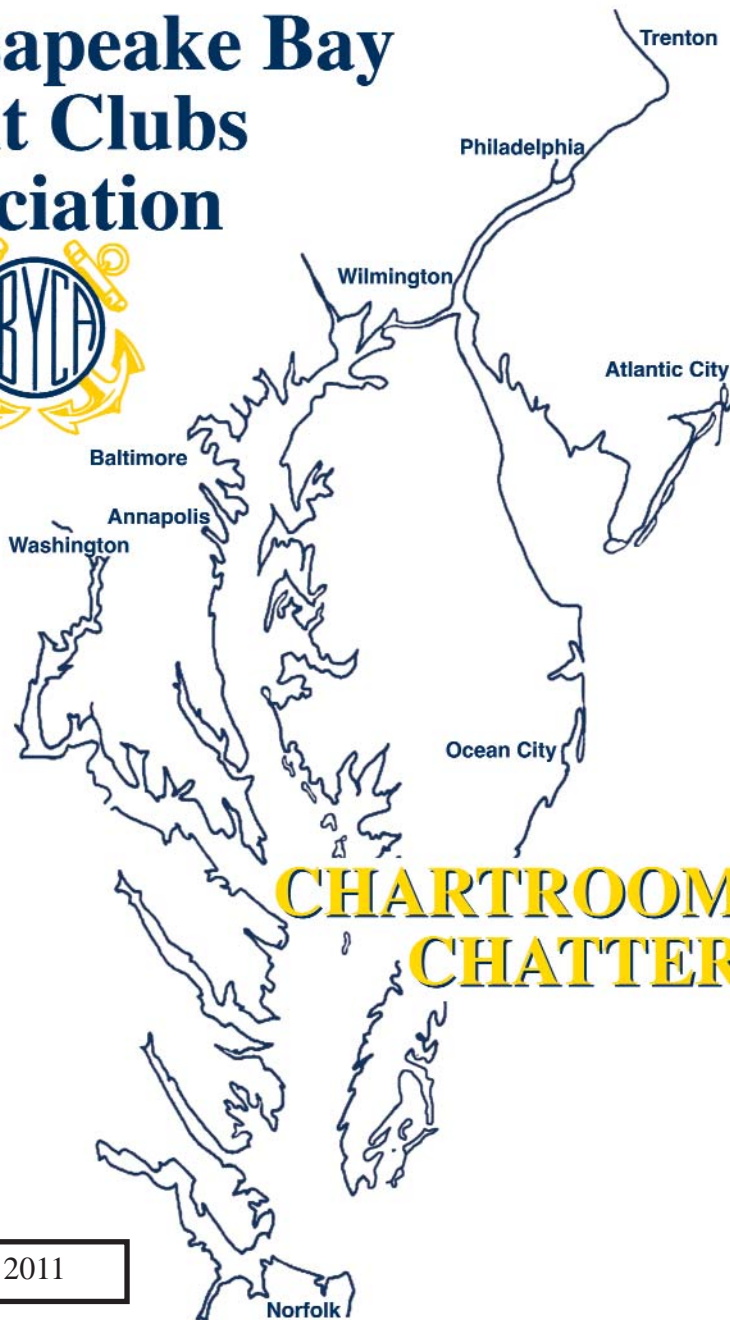

The Maryland General meets in Annapolis for the 428 session on January 12, 2011. The newly elected and returning 41 Senators and 141 Delegates from 47 districts will have more than 2300 bills to review. Legislation of interest for the boating community will be noted and followed during this upcoming session.

A recap of the total of 2700 pieces of legislation introduced during the 2010 session of the Maryland General Assembly noted approximately 30% of those bills (810) successfully passed in both chambers. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Legislative Office tracked a total of 470 bills during the 2010 session.

The Department successfully progressed legislation that improves boating safety by requiring individuals under the age of 13 to wear a personal flotation device while aboard a vessel underway and requiring vessel operators younger than age 16 to possess a certificate of boating safety education under certain conditions (Senate Bill 92)

Enable law enforcement officers to compel impairment testing for vehicle accidents where the driver is operating under the influence (Senate Bill 475)

Ensuring the removal of abandoned or derelict vessels occurs in a timelier manner (House Bill 527). This information was supplied through the office of the Director of Government Relations, Maryland Department of Natural Resources. Additional info is available at their website at MLIS.STATE.MD.US

Pennsylvania/New Jersey Legislative Report

The Delaware Riverkeeper via certified mail sent October 18, 2010 to the Secretary of the Army and Secretary of Commerce stated a 60 day Notice of Intent to file a citizen suit pursuant to the endangered species act IF the Army Corps of Engineers fails to conference with the National Marine Fisheries Service under the endangered species act section 7(a)4 on the impacts of the Delaware main channel deepening project on Atlantic Sturgeon.

2010 marked the sixth anniversary of the Water Resources Plan For The Delaware River Basin. During the past year, advances made to protect, enhance and restore water resources included the ongoing discussions of drafting new

regulations for natural gas well pad projects in shale formations in the Delaware River Basin.

Some of the boating regulations in effect are noted,

PA requires unpowered boats to be registered while using lakes or access areas and display a Commission issued use permit. Other requirements are available on line at THE OUTDOOR SHOP.

There are 85,000 miles of rivers and streams available for various types of water activity, the applicable license for usage of these resources should be noted. A person born after January 1, 1982 when operating a boat with a motor greater than 25 hp and any one operating a PWC, needs a PA Boating Safety Certificate. New Jersey

The States Organization for Boating Access recently awarded the New Jersey DEP Clean Vessel Act Program its Program Excellence Award in recognition of the work it is doing to protect and enhance water quality along the coast.

The DEP's Clean Vessel Act Program has 170 pumpout stations at marinas all along the Jersey coast, including many strategically stationed in the Barnegat Bay area, which also has a small flotilla of pumpout boats on patrol. This effort has removed and treated upwards of five million gallons of sewage since the late 1990s _ material that would have contaminated New Jersey's waters.

The Clean Vessel Act Program, approved by Congress in 1992, provides grants for the construction, renovation, operation, and maintenance of pumpout stations and waste reception facilities for recreational boaters, and for educational programs that inform boaters of the importance of proper disposal of sewage, while encouraging boaters to use pumpouts

The United States Fish and Wildlife Service provide overall administration of the program, which is overseen in New Jersey by the DEP's Division of Fish and Wildlife. But it also is a collaborative effort of many participants from public and private agencies and organizations.

Representatives from the Division of Fish and Wildlife, Marine Trades Association of New Jersey, Monmouth County Health Department, N.J. Sea Grant Consortium and the Ocean County Planning Department make up the Clean Vessel Act Steering Committee, which handles pumpout applications, contracts, budget and funding issues, information and education programs, and program guidance.

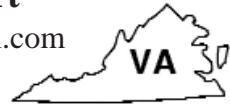

Virginia Legislative Report

Eminent Domain Again Threatens Old Dominion Yacht Club

The deadline for the pre-filing of Virginia legislation for the 2011 session was the week of December 6, and as of the deadline on December 15, no bills had been filed that would directly affect recreational voters. Nothing is on the agenda for the opening day January 12 in Richmond about personal floatation devices for children, marina standards or boating restrictions.

However, legislative action to restrict local governments from taking property through eminent domain laws will be issues of interest to boaters, particularly Alexandria boaters and CBYCA boaters who might want to travel up the Potomac River and visit a sister club.

On December 16, the City of Alexandria unveiled a sweeping plan for new development that would take in the Potomac shoreline site of Virginia's oldest boat club, the Old Dominion Boat Club at the foot of King Street in the city's prime downtown area.

Although the Club still has not agreed, the city reportedly wants to trade another property in order to build a public plaza on the site of the club's downtown parking lot. The assistant city manager said at the public unveiling of the city's waterfront project that the club had not agreed to the trade. But he hinted that city officials would not rule out using eminent domain to settle the issue. It's a legal tool that is in every government's toolbox that nobody likes to use. The goal is to reach mutual agreement, Assistant City Manager Mark Jinks told residents who previewed a model of the \$32-42 million plan for the plaza including Old Dominion's facility. The Alexandria proposal will be introduced in draft form in January, and public hearings will start in April.

CBYCA will track pre-filed Senate Joint Resolution 21 when the Assembly opens. The resolution states that the General Assembly should define public uses, not the local government that might want to take the property.

Budget Tightens on Boating Safety

Virginia legislators will seek to control future spending by taking the interest from several agency trust funds and placing it in the General Fund rather than using it to meet expenses and expand programs. The Department of Games and Inland Fisheries had proposed an increase in Boating Safety Regulation funding from \$6,688,308 to \$8,457,953. However, the pre-filed budget would cut the increase and leave the budget figure at the current amount.

Nearly \$2 million in dedicated special revenue from boating education registration would also go into the General Fund rather than for boating safety outreach or be used to match federal funds that might be appropriated.

NMMA, Engine Manufacturers File Suit on E15 Decision

The National Marine Manufacturers Assc. (NMMA) filed suit in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, challenging the October 13, 2010 decision by the EPA to partially approve E15 for a subset of on-highway motor vehicles. NMMA has joined with several other manufacturing groups in a newly formed coalition - the Engine Products Group (EPG) - in pursuing this legal challenge. NMMA expressed regret in having to pursue litigation, but stated that the EPA has not fulfilled its statutory obligations to ensure the safe introduction of E15. NMMA has urged full scientific testing on marine engines and equipment, as required by law, and the rational evaluation of policy mechanisms to protect consumers from misfueling and product failures caused by E15. In the meantime Congress is considering a bill that would shield retailers from liability suits for miss-fueled engines.

A related and significant issue is that subsidies (last year, \$7.7 billion) to the ethanol producers are set to automatically expire at the end of this year. While Republican fiscal hard liners are working to not continue the subsidies; at this time we have not heard if they will be continued or not.

NBF Letter to US Coast Guard

We have sent a letter to the Commandant of the USCG and the Chief of the Office of Boating Safety, informing them of our concerns for the safety of the boating public with the presence of ethanol in marine fuel. While out on the water at night, in a storm or in a fog, engine failure could have disastrous consequences. To date the USCG does not appear to view ethanol as a safety issue.
