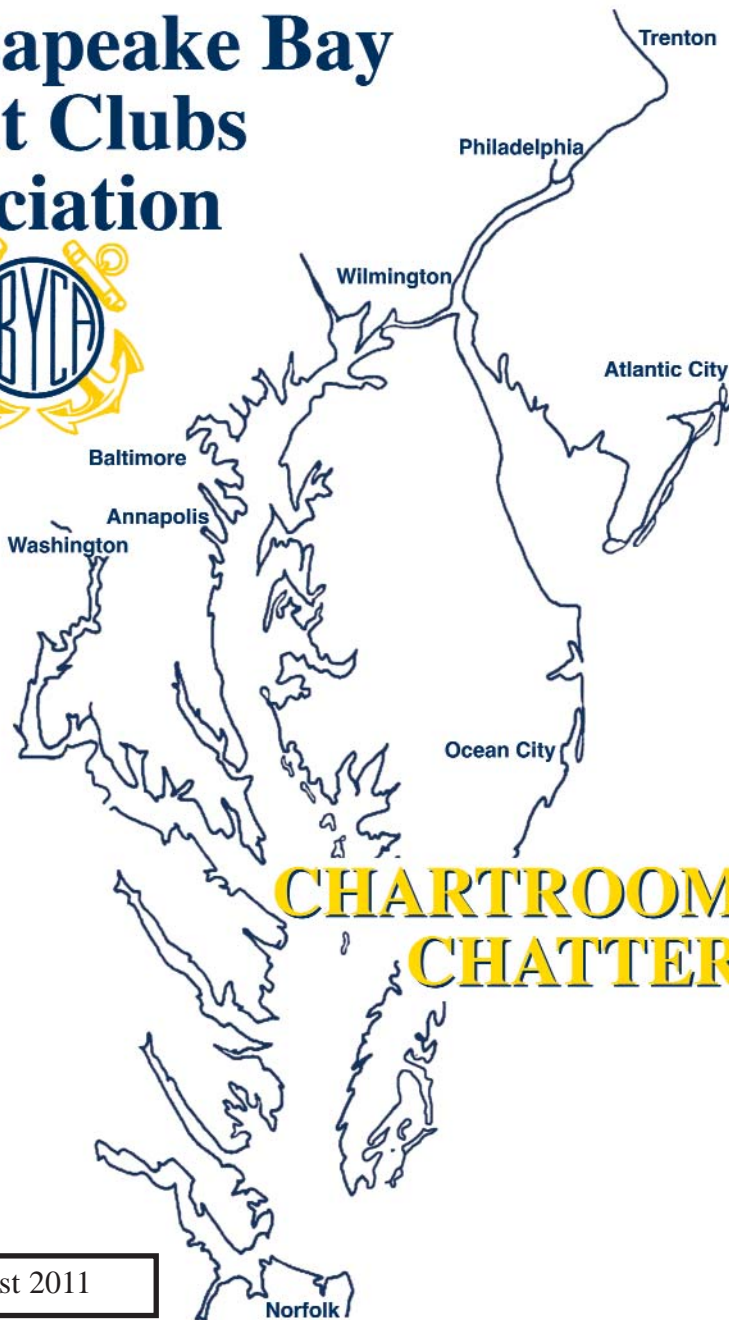

Maryland Legislative Report

The Maryland General Assembly has recessed until January 2012.

On July 19, 2011 Governor O'Malley announced members of the Marcellus Shale Safe Drilling Initiative, the Secretaries of the Departments of the Environment and Natural Resources, in consultation with the Advisory Commission, will study issues related to natural gas exploration and production in the Marcellus Shale in Maryland. Commission members include a broad range of stakeholders and representatives from the scientific community, the gas industry, business, agriculture, environmental organizations, citizens and government. The Commission will be chaired by David Vanko, Ph. D., a geologist and current Dean of The Jess and Mildred Fisher College of Science and Mathematics at Towson University.

By December 31, 2011, a presentation of findings and related recommendations regarding the desirability of legislation to establish revenue sources, such as State-level severance tax, and the desirability of legislation to establish standards of liability for damages caused by gas exploration and production.

Recommendations for best practices for all aspects of natural gas exploration and production in the Marcellus Shale in Maryland will be presented by August 1, 2012.

A final report with findings and recommendations relating to the impact of Marcellus Shale drilling including possible contamination of groundwater, handling and disposal of wastewater, environmental and natural resources impacts, impacts to forests and important habitats, greenhouse gas emissions and economic impact.

The Executive Order also instructs the Departments and advisory Commission to take advantage of other ongoing research. If information becomes available during the course of the study that is sufficient to demonstrate that the natural gas can be extracted from shale formations in Maryland without adverse impact to human health, natural resources, or the environment, the Department could issue permits with all appropriate safeguards in place.

Bill to protect Delaware River Basin

The Delaware River Basin Conservation Act would require the director of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

1. to create and adopt a region-wide plan that would guide restoration and conservation efforts in the 13,600-square-mile watershed.
2. It would also authorize \$5 million a year in competitive grant funds to support restoration projects by nonprofit groups, universities, and state and local governments.
3. Typical projects include the restoration of wetlands, grasslands, and other natural areas that provide habitats for endangered species and migratory birds. Other efforts center on maintaining water quality and preventing erosion.

This legislation would provide assistance for habitat improvement, water quality enhancement, and flood control to protect the watershed and the Pennsylvanians who rely on it. The Delaware River Basin Conservation Act proposal is a bid to increase the profile of the region's most important waterway. Local conservation groups are looking for a little respect for the Delaware River Basin. The watershed, which crosses four states, encompasses the largest drinking water supply for the Middle Atlantic region. But in Washington, D.C., the waterway's significance is overshadowed by the Great Lakes, Puget Sound and the Chesapeake Bay.

Duplicate bills in the House and Senate would establish the first coordinated restoration strategy across New York, Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Jersey.

No more slack for DUI boaters

A new Pennsylvania state law will impose tougher penalties for homicide by boat while driving under the influence.

The law will raise the severity of homicide by boat while under the influence from a third-degree felony to a second-degree felony.

Minimum jail time for the infraction is three years. If more than one person is killed, a consecutive three-year jail term will be imposed for each additional victim.

The maximum sentence is 10 years, up from the former law's seven-year maximum, under the old rules, DUI boaters' convictions for driving under the influence on the road were not considered by courts. Now any prior DUI record will be included, meaning a boating DUI will not be considered a first offense for people with a record of on-road DUIs.

Gov. Tom Corbett signed the bill into law, and it will go into effect in early September.

Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission pushes for lifejackets mandate

A move to require boaters to wear lifejackets in winter will take time. Currently, children younger than 12, personal watercraft drivers and their passengers and anyone towed behind a boat are required to wear a lifejacket at all times in Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission's boating advisory board has recommended that the full commission mandate that boaters wear

lifejackets when on the water between Nov. 1 and midnight April 30.

Fish and Boat Commissioners will be asked to decide whether to give the measure preliminary approval... If they do, the idea will go out for public comment; Final approval would have to follow that.

The commission won't enact the regulations before fall of 2012. For years in Pennsylvania, motorcyclists were required by law to wear a helmet when on the road.

Now, boaters could be facing something similar.

Pennsylvania and New Jersey once again are in the midst of a dispute.

Westerly winds are blowing a significant portion of sulfur dioxide from Pennsylvania over the Delaware River into New Jersey.

Sulfur dioxide is a major air pollutant that can aggravate asthma and can also cause bronchitis and other respiratory diseases.

The pollutant combines with other contaminants and water vapor falls onto the ground as acid rain.

New Jersey officials say that Pennsylvania regulators haven't done enough to control pollution emissions from state power plants.

Fish & Boat Commission Quarterly Business Meeting

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) held its summer quarterly meeting on July 11-12 at its Harrisburg office.

Commission committees met beginning at 9:40 a.m. on Monday, July 11, and again at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, July 12. Formal consideration of the agenda by the full Commission began at 11:35 a.m. on Tuesday, July 12. All committee meetings and the formal meeting were open to the public.

During Tuesday's formal meeting, Commissioners addressed a variety of issues, on fishing limits at various lakes. No boating issues were discussed.

Marcellus Shale Commission Issues Final Report

Lt. Governor Jim Cawley released the final report of the Marcellus Shale Advisory Commission, taking the first step toward developing a comprehensive and strategic plan for responsible natural gas drilling in Pennsylvania.

The unanimously-adopted report contains 96 policy recommendations that include tougher regulations for drilling, doubling fines for violations, creating jobs in related industries and promoting the use of natural gas vehicles.

Some of the key recommendations the panel made to Governor Corbett include:

- Increasing the distance between gas well sites and streams, private wells and public water systems.
- Posting more information online for the public.
- Tougher civil and criminal penalties for violators
- Assisting PA companies to do business with natural gas industry.
- Training Pennsylvanians to work in the industry.

- Developing Green Corridors for vehicles powered by natural gas.

This Commission formed by Governor Corbett brought the industry, environmental groups and local government leaders together to the same table where they methodically and publicly worked out these comprehensive recommendations, said Cawley.

House hearing on potential GPS interference: As reported by Holland and Knight the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure conducted a hearing on potential GPS interference.

The hearing focused primarily on plans by the company LightSquared, to build a nationwide broadband internet infrastructure that uses radio frequency bandwidth right next to existing GPS bandwidth which will probably cause interference and affect GPS reliability. Preliminary government testing has validated concerns that the high-powered signal proposed by LightSquared may adversely impact the GPS signal. NBF has voiced its concern in a letter to the Chairman of the FCC urging them to withhold authorization for LightSquared operations until all valid concerns of the GPS user community have been resolved.

Meanwhile, the House Committee on Appropriations issued a press release stating that it approved the FY 2012 Financial Services Appropriations Bill, as amended. Among the amendments included in the bill is one that prohibits the FCC from removing conditions on or to permit certain commercial broadband operations until the FCC has resolved concerns of harmful interference by these operations on GPS devices.

Coastal and Marine Spatial Planning Workshop: At the invitation of the National Oceans Council, I attended the Coastal and Marine Spatial Planning (CMSP) Workshop on 21 June at the Dept of the Interior in Washington DC. There were over 500 in attendance and 200 more through a webinar. The purpose of the workshop was to bring together Federal, State, public and regional representatives to develop an understanding of the CMSP process, build a community of CMSP users and consider future steps for regional implementation. The Workshop was also used to gather public feedback toward implementing "a National Policy for the stewardship of the Ocean, our Coasts and the Great Lakes (National Ocean Policy), as established by Executive Order 13547, under President Obama." Following the opening remarks and various panel sessions, a question and answer period was provided for. I pointed out that with 14 million registered boats, and 60 million participants recreational boating is a significant contributor to our GDP and that full consideration should be given to boating in any oceans policy planning.

To facilitate ocean planning, Dr. John Oliver, USCG, indicated there will be nine regional ocean areas. To create their plans, a Regional Planning Body will be established in each region. They will hold meetings and from that create a final CMS plan and then submit it to the National Ocean Policy. At the Workshop conclusion Andy Lipsky, the Ocean Policy Advisor, indicated all questions and answers will be provided in the Workshop summary which is now in preparation.
