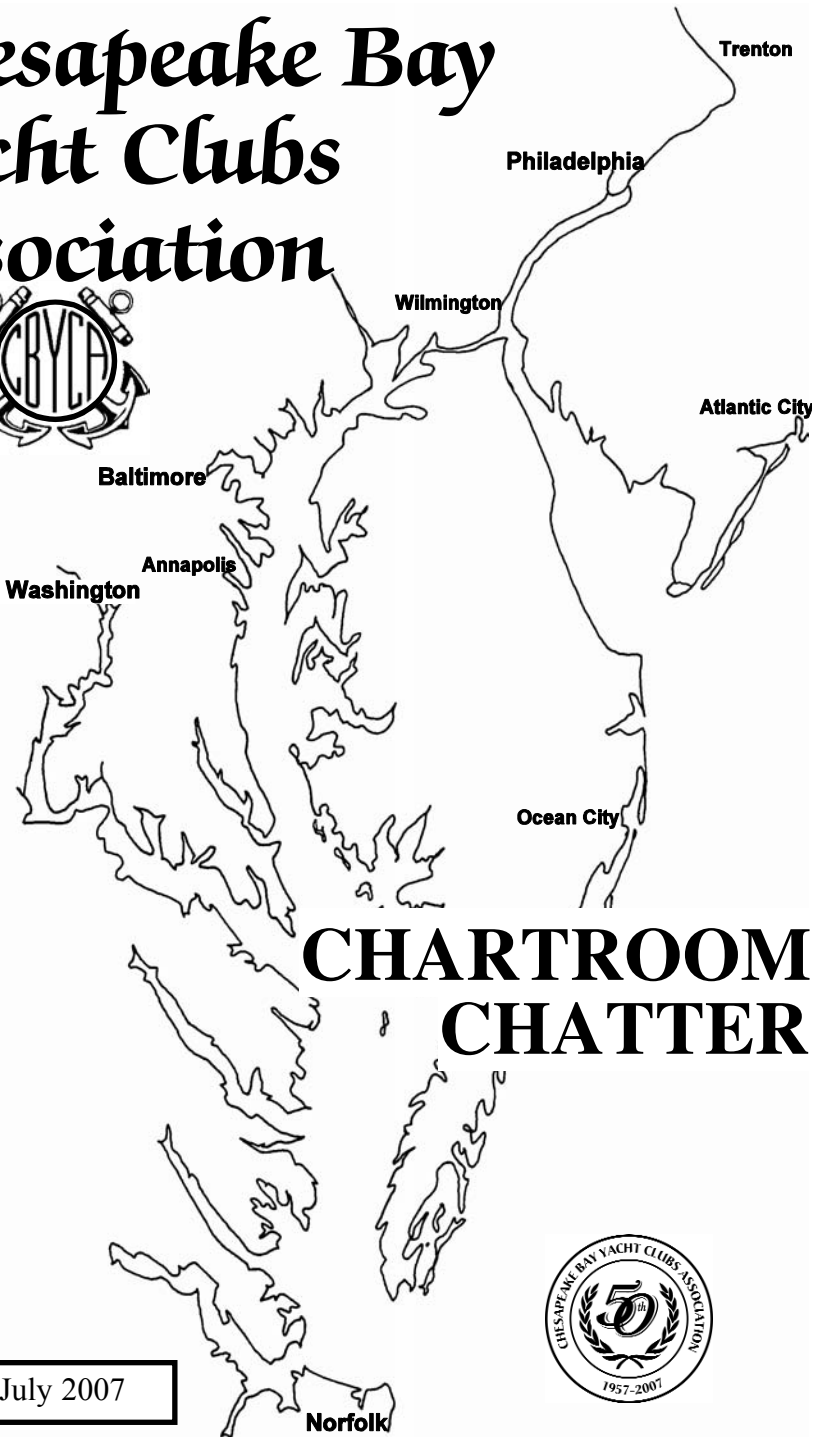

## Legislative Director's Report

The Pennsylvania Senate is currently reviewing SB 538 which would expand the Pa Automobile Lemon Law to include boats and personal water craft. As expected the National Marine Manufacturers and the Personal Water Craft Industry Assoc. are strongly opposed to the bill. The Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee gave a favorable report on the bill and it was re-referred to the Senate Appropriations Committee chaired by Senator Gibson Armstrong, where it is awaiting action. I strongly urge all Pennsylvania boaters or anyone who purchased a boat in Pennsylvania to write Senator Gibson Armstrong, Senate Appropriations Committee Room 281 Main Capital Bldg. Harrisburg, Pa. 17120 in support of this bill. Virginia, New Jersey, Ohio and California currently have lemon laws to cover watercraft. If we can add Pennsylvania to that list I would look forward to working toward Delaware and Maryland legislators introducing a similar bill.



## Maryland Legislative Report

Governor's Task Force Study of the Boating Industry in Maryland.  
Act: Chapter 23 (2007 Senate Bill 165 & House Bill 305)

Susan Zeller, Executive Director of the Maryland Marine Trade Association contacted me regarding the above legislation, successfully passed during the spring legislative session. We met on Thursday, May 31 in Annapolis to discuss the next steps regarding the purpose and development of the study of the boating industry in Maryland. Governor Martin O'Malley's office is in the process of working closely with Susan for recommendations and appointments of eight members to the Task Force in addition to the governmental department representatives. The 8 members will include as follows: 2 from the Marine Trade Association; 2 from local tourism boards, 1 marina owner and operator, 1 boat dealership owner, 1 Maryland Tourism Council, and 1 local yacht club representative (requested to come from CBYCA). The scope of work will include a research white paper on the boating industry which will hopefully set the stage for legislation in next year's session; the work needs to be completed by October; meetings to gather information will take place June--August with the writing of paper in September and final project due in early October. At the recommendation of Commodore Don Burton, the CBYCA Board voted the approval of me to represent CBYCA on the Task Force with Vice Commodore Coles Marsh as Alternate.

It is reported that there is some discussion among legislators regarding a possible service and slip tax in Maryland for next year's session. CBYCA needs to follow this closely so that we can be effective with our legislative efforts as in the past.

## Pennsylvania/ New Jersey Legislative Report

### Pennsylvania

**A00622**, by Rohrer, replaces the current language to allow the gift voucher program to work with the Point-of-Sales system and permits the PA Fish and Boat Commission to write regulations as needed. The amendment was unanimously adopted.

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission received a proposal to amend boating safety regulations (§97.1) to require the wearing of PFDs by all persons when on board boats less than 16 feet in length or any canoe or kayak during the period of October 1 through May 31. The Commission rejected the proposal as unnecessary and has no plans to reconsider.

**SB 468 Regola** - (PN 513) Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the PA Constitution by adding a provision prohibiting the General Assembly from convening a voting session between the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November (Election Day) through November 30 in any even-numbered year. This legislation would effectively eliminate lame-duck sessions. - The bill was unanimously reported as committed.

**House Bill 778** amends the Fish and Boat Code to make boating under the influence statutes similar to the state's driving under the influence language in the Vehicle Code. The blood alcohol threshold necessary to be found guilty of operating a watercraft under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance will be the same as in federal guidelines - the individual's blood alcohol must be at least 0.08, but less than 0.10.

**House Bill 778**, which passed 196-1, now proceeds to the Senate Game and Fisheries Committee for consideration. If enacted, the bill would take effect immediately.

### Dredging the Delaware River

Pennsylvania has made an agreement to dredge the Delaware River which has resulted in a planned meeting of the Port Authority Commissioners for the first time in 18 months. The agreement involves Pennsylvania paying for the entire project as well as disposing of all the dredge spoils. A new environmental impact study will be conducted.

## New Jersey

Van Drew/Diegnan Bill Addressing Issues Over Abandoned Boats Clears Assembly Panel. The Van Drew/Diegnan measure (A-3767) would: "Expand the statutory definition of abandoned vessels to include sunken vessels; "Facilitate the removal of sunken or abandoned vessels from municipal waterways or land; "Increase the penalties for violations of law concerning vessel abandonment. Specifically, the bill would make it a disorderly person's offense to abandon a vessel on any public land or body of water. Disorderly person's offenses carry a penalty of up to six months in jail and \$1,000 in fines.

**Assembly Bill A2212**, requires children under the age of 16 to wear personal flotation devices when on a vessel that is underway. The bill has been referred to the Assembly Law & Public Safety Committee

**Assembly Bill A1953**, , proposes that owners of boats powered with an excess of 25 horsepower must maintain mandatory \$100,000 liability insurance against a loss for bodily injury or death, for one person, and \$200,000 per accident for more than one person.

**Senate Bill S139**. The bill restricts the operation of personal watercraft, requiring them to stay at least 100 feet (instead of the current 50 feet) away from residential dwelling units, buoys or signs that mark the boundaries of a swimming area, the shoreline or persons in the water. It was passed by the Senate (36-0) in February 2006, and sent to the Assembly (as A2509), where it was referred to the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee.

**Senate Bill S2233**, , was introduced and referred to the Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee in October 2006. This bill requires operators and passengers riding a personal watercraft to wear a helmet when underway.

**Senate Bill S916**, sponsored by Senator Anthony R. Bucco, was introduced in the Senate and referred to the Senate Transportation Committee in January 2006. This bill would extend to recreational boaters in New Jersey refunds currently available from the motor fuels tax for gasoline purchased for use in boats and used for recreational purposes.

### **Legislation Introduced To Ease Undue Regulations on Recreational Boaters**

As the nation's 73 million recreational boaters celebrated the start of the 2007 boating season during Memorial Day weekend, Congress took action to preserve recreational boating as we know it. Congressional Sportsmen's Caucus Members, Representatives Gene Taylor (D-MS) and Candice Miller (R-MI) have introduced legislation to prevent commercial shipping regulations from expanding and burdening family boaters. Unless Congress passes this legislation, boaters could spend future Memorial Day weekends waiting in long lines to pay for expensive new permits.

**H.R. 2550**, "The Recreational Boating Act of 2007," would permanently codify the longstanding exemption for incidental recreational boat discharges under the Clean Water Act. It would grant EPA authority to reinstate its 34-year exemption for recreational boats, which a U.S. District Court nullified in Sept. 2006. Boats will continue to be heavily regulated for sewage, oil, garbage and other pollutants under existing statutes.

**Global Maritime Distress & Safety System (GMDSS) & Rescue 21**

GMDSS is an upgrade of maritime communications worldwide and includes Rescue 21, the advanced search and rescue communication system now being installed in the US. To date, some areas have achieved Initial Operational Capability (IOC). These include a Atlantic City, NJ, Eastern Shore, VA, two areas in the Gulf and the upper northwest. When the DSC button is engaged on the VHF radio, distress information is broadcast over channel 70. All are encouraged to interface their VHF to a GPS or Loran unit so that precise position data is sent out. This is assuming you have updated your VHF radio with the DSC capability. Schedules for future Rescue 21 installations show all remaining CBYCA areas scheduled for completion in 2008. The next IOC location is expected to be in Long Island Sound, NY.

**National Recreational Boating Safety Coalition**

The Coalition continues to do good work in the implementation of boating safety legislation nationwide. Comprised of members from government, industry and private organizations (including NBF), the Coalition provides direct legislative support in States offering safety legislation. As reported, Virginia has finally passed a Mandatory Boating Education (MBE) bill after many previous attempts. To date, all but 13 states have MBE, all states have BWI laws and all but a few states have child PFD laws. One state, Alabama, has boat operator licensing but Hawaii has just introduced boat operator license legislation. NBF does not support licensing.

**Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFÉ)**

Political movement is picking up on raising CAFÉ standards on automobile fuel consumption. Representative Dingell of Michigan, Chairman of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, has told the industry to expect some bad news in the proposed legislation. CAFÉ standards have not been raised in some years. The impact could be significant for those who tow boats. Improving fuel economy usually result in less power, thus reducing a vehicle's towing capacity.
